Distinguishing Field Characteristics:

tiny size; olive above, white to pale yellow below; two white wingbars and black bar at base of secondaries; short, notched tail; incomplete, white eyering; dark bill and eyes; (m) red crest, usually kept concealed

Notes:

common; mostly solitary, but often mixes with other species; very active, flicking its tail persistently while foraging; found in a variety of habitats from brushy areas to woodlands throughout most of NA, wintering in the southern region; 3 subspecies; forages in shrubery and trees for small insects, spiders, fruit, seeds, etc.
