### Distinguishing Field Characteristics:

tiny size; gray overall (paler below) with bright yellow head, chestnut shoulder patch (lesser coverts); relatively long gray tail; short, sharply pointed bill; dark eyes and eyeline (adults); juvenile lacks yellow head, shoulder patch

### Notes:

common; solitary; native to desert scrublands from se CA east to c TX, south through most of MEX; one of the smallest songbirds in NA; only member of Remizidae in NA; 6 subspecies; primarily eats insects, also some nectar

Mojave presence: year-round

### **Comments:**

These active, tiny songbirds build their spherical nests of twigs, grass, feathers, etc. in shrubs and thickets. I caught
